

Clayton Hall Landfill Site

We continue to make regular visits to the landfill site. This includes the use of a drone to provide a better overview of the levels of cover on the waste material that helps reduce odour. There has been a decrease in the number of reports recently.

We have reduced the frequency of our visits in the community. There is an indication that the risk from the overtipped waste is being better managed, however we will remain ready to increase our odour assessments if required.

There has been work carried out on the area of the site that caused issues in 2018, that has been carried out with additional measures required by our landfill engineers.

The reduction in the overtipped waste on top of the landfill is still under assessment, there are profiled levels that the operator must meet from a planning perspective, that includes the final level once the cover materials have been put in place.

Our engineering specialists are focussed on plans for the next stage of capping that Quercia have stated is scheduled to start soon. There are industry standards for the capping activity and the installation of gas management that we expect Quercia to meet when doing this.

As mentioned in the last update, there are plans to develop the final cell of the landfill. The construction of the cell will need to be carried out to industry standard and require Construction Quality Assurance (CQA). We are reviewing submissions made by Quercia. This will effectively be the final area of the landfill.

We are investigating why Quercia chose to stockpile waste on the landfill site and increase the risk from odour that impacted the community. We will update on this as soon as we can.

We do also have a live investigation from 2018, again once we are able, we will let the community know any outcome as soon as we can.
