

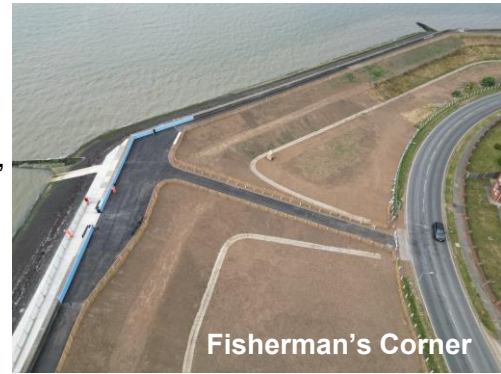

Fisherman's Corner ramp temporary closure

At the end of September, we will be applying a protective coating to the Fisherman's Corner ramp to provide additional protection to the concrete. We will need to close the ramp for three weeks for this work. During this time, the maintenance access tracks will also be inaccessible. Noise mitigation measures, including acoustic barriers, will be implemented, and certain areas will be closed to the public including the disabled parking bays at Fisherman's Corner. Please see the map below for further details. We need to apply this protective coating at this time as the concrete on the ramp needed to cure before the protection is applied. We also wanted to minimise disruption by scheduling this work outside of the summer break. Thank you for your cooperation during these works.

Project background

The work we are currently carrying out will protect the tidal defences against erosion and extend their useful life to 2070 in light of increasing sea levels due to climate change. The works are delivered as part of the Thames Estuary Asset Management (TEAM) 2100 Programme. This is the single largest investment in Canvey Island's tidal defences since they were raised in the early 1980s.
