

# Boston Barrier Transport & Works Act order application

## More information about the application

The proposed order, if made, would authorise the construction and operation of a new tidal barrier with a moveable gate across the river Witham (also known in Boston as the Haven). In addition to this it would also authorise construction of a new building to enable operation of the barrier, new flood defence walls on both banks of the Haven, a replacement gate across the entrance to the existing Port Wet Dock and to execute ancillary works, including dredging of the river.

The proposed Order would authorise the compulsory acquisition and the temporary use of land and confers other powers in connection with the construction, operation and maintenance of the works. The Order would also confer powers to alter, stop up and divert existing paths and streets.

The Order application is to be made subject to an environmental impact assessment.

The Order application contains a statement that a direction for deemed planning permission is being applied for in relation to the development that would be authorised by the Order.

The Agency is also applying to Boston Borough Council for listed building consent to carry out the work specified in the third column of the following table to the structure specified in the second column of that table.

Reference number	Address or description of the building/structure	Works in respect of which listed building consent is sought
1389072	Maud Foster Sluice Boston, Lincolnshire	The construction of a flood wall abutting the parapet of the Grade II listed Maud Foster Sluice, with the creation of a water tight joint which does not require intrusive work into the structure.

In accordance with section 12(3A) of the Planning (Listed Buildings and Conservation Areas) Act 1990 the application for the listed building consent will be automatically referred by Boston Borough Council to the Secretary of State for Communities and Local Government.
