



The River Roding Project

February 2024 update

Overview

The River Roding Project aims to reduce flooding to homes, businesses and infrastructure in the Woodford and Ilford areas. It will also provide improvements to the river for people and wildlife.

Current Progress

The project has received planning permission to build a flood storage area upstream of the M25. The business case has received sign-off and we will begin construction in spring 2024.

We expect to complete construction during 2026.
