A planned joint inspection with the Health & Safety Executive was carried out to review on-site records relating to cement bond logs, evaluation logs of the well casing, casing tests and the mud logging unit.


This is the second such joint inspection with the Health & Safety Executive and follows the remit laid out in the joint working memorandum of understanding. The topic of well integrity can cover two key priorities in the regulation of shale gas exploration, well safety and the protection of groundwater, the later fits solely within the remit of the Environment Agency whilst well safety is addressed by the HSE.

During the inspection we also took the opportunity to inspect surface water management, particularly the free draining site surface and open drainage ditch. An evaporation test was being conducted at the time of the inspection with surface water from the open drainage ditch pumped on to the well pad surface, sufficient free draining was observed.

Work has been completed to the concrete plinth for the flare base, pre-operational condition PO9 requires the submission of details of the position of the two flares on the well pad prior to the commencement of the flaring activity. Pre-operational condition PO10 requires the submission of a written operational and control procedure for the management for the management of Activity A1 (flaring). Both pre-operational conditions require approval before Activity A1 can commence.

Pre-operational conditions PO5 & PO6 require the completion of a well integrity test in line with the waste management plan, the details of this well integrity test shall be provided for approval. Since this inspection was conducted details of the integrity test for well 1z has been provided as required by pre-operational conditions PO5 & PO6, a separate review of these submissions will be provided. It is understood that a well integrity report will be provided for well 2 upon completion of the lateral.

Specific records were viewed during this inspection which included the well casing & cementing programme, records of pressure test results demonstrating well integrity. It was noted that during the integrity testing no remedial work was required. Observed records demonstrated that pressure testing has been performed to the total depth of the well at 10,000 PSI providing a satisfactory test. Records of cement bond logs demonstrated a satisfactory bond between the well casing and cement, and between the cement and the geological formation throughout the length of the well.
