This site inspection provided a training opportunity for an additional EPR inspector and a familiarisation visit for our seismic specialist.

Drilling of well PNR2 had ceased having reached the total depth required. Casing of the well will now commence to complete installation of the well. Once this work finishes installation of the geophones will be undertaken. We intend to conduct a site inspection with our seismic specialist to observe the installation of the geophones.

On 1 June 2018 a drawing (Ref: PNR-ENG-DRW-002 Rev 5 Flare Location) showing the location of each of the two flares was received in line with pre-operational condition 9 (PO9, Table S1.3). We can confirm that the document submitted is appropriate to meet the requirements of PO9.

Submission and approval of PO10 is required prior to using the flares, which requires a written operational and control procedure for the incineration of natural gas (Schedule 1, Activity A1, Table S1.1). A draft copy of PO10 was presented to us during the inspection but not removed from site. We shall formally review the final draft when submitted.

Inspection of the flares and associated equipment in situ was undertaken.

Inspection of the hazardous mining waste facility referenced as A3 in Table S1.1 of the environmental permit. Drill cuttings, water based drilling muds storage in enclosed containers observed, no spillages or loss of containment detected.

Inspection of the methane analyser, hydrogen sulphide (H₂S) monitor and weather station on site boundary.

Noticeable but localised oily odours detected on site around oil based drilling mud storage only. Odour was not detected beyond the boundary of the site.

At 21:07 on 29 June 2018 an odour complaint was received from a member of the public reporting a strong smell of H₂S gas in the area. The operator was informed and asked to investigate. No alarms had been received or triggered and no odour was found to be coming from the site. The complaint investigation was followed up during this inspection, no H₂S was picked up by monitoring instruments on and around the time of the complaint.

At 00:12 on 5 July 2018 an odour complaint was received from a member of the public, noticed at 22:05 on 4 July 2018. The report referenced a smell of rotten eggs rated 4 out of 6. The operator was informed prompting an investigation. We understand that no noticeable H₂S odour was detected at the time of the complaint. H₂S data collected at the time of the complaint recorded zero on the drilling rig. No H₂S odour was noticed at the time of this inspection.

At 15:27 on 5 July 2018 a complaint of odour described as acid and chemicals was reported by a member of the public, rating it a 4 out of 6. Vibrations were also noted. The operator was informed immediately of the complaint which prompted an investigation. No odour of acid or chemicals were detected on site during the reported period and no vibrations were felt at the site. There were no new operations at the site likely to cause vibrations and none were detected during the site inspection.

Routine groundwater sampling from borehole 1 (BH1) was observed.
