This was an unannounced inspection.

Hydraulic fracturing was not taking place at the time of the inspection. At the same time, the Environment Agency's Radioactive Substance Regulations (RSR) inspection was also on site. Please refer to I/181206/KB3395DE for the RSR inspection record.

Flowback

Stages 1 to 31 (1z) had been opened and the well was flowing back fracturing fluid. Flowback was being passed through the sand filter and separator before being sent to the frac farm tanks for re-use.

The frac farm tanks were inspected and two thirds contained flowback. All tanks were labelled appropriately. A demonstration of how the flowback will be sampled prior to sending it off site as a waste was provided by the operator. No flowback had been removed from site at the time of the inspection.

Surface water from different tanks was being removed from site by tankers to increase capacity in preparation for forecasted rainfall.

The detailed sampling plan for sampling waste flowback is being finalised. Since this inspection a copy of the sampling plan has been submitted and is now under review.

New Cellar

An area on site is being prepared for the installation of a new cellar prior to drilling Wells 3 and 4. The area had been cordoned off and the layers of gravel had been scraped back in preparation for the works to commence. The area was inspected and there were no breaches of the well pad liner. Standing water from recent rain was being transferred to the drainage ditch.

Since the inspection, the Environment Agency has been informed that the cellar for Wells 3 and 4 is no longer going to be installed imminently and the area is to be re-instated using the same as the original materials. Containment of the well pad liner had not been broken.

A1 - Flaring

The flare pilot lights, which ensure the flares are always ready to burn the natural gas returning from the well, on both flares were lit. No natural gas from the well was being burnt in the flares at the time of the inspection.

The flare register template was submitted to the Environment Agency by email on 22 November 2018 for approval in line with permit table S3.6. Please accept this CAR form as confirmation of approval of the template flare register.

A copy of the flare register was viewed which showed a record of when the flare was used in line with permit table S3.6.
