This was the fifth in a series of visits assessing hydraulic fracturing activities for Well 1z and was a joint inspection with Lancashire County Council. All activities assessed were compliant with the requirements of the Environmental Permit.

At the time of the inspection no hydraulic fracturing was taking place. Cementing works to close stages 30 and 31 are currently being planned by Cuadrilla and hydraulic fracturing is not expected to resume until this has been completed.

Daily Morning Reports

The daily morning reports for activities taking place on 3rd - 7th November were reviewed. No sub-surface permit boundary breaches recorded.
