This site inspection provided a training opportunity for an additional EPR inspector.

Drilling activities were completed in July 2018. Preparations on site are being made to receive the hydraulic fracturing equipment. The separation tank, which will separate sands from the flowback before re-use, was delivered to site and inspected. The tank was in good repair. Additional temporary bunding for chemical delivery was being installed and was observed in place. Bunding was also being installed for fracturing fluid and flowback tanks. This bunding is in addition to the existing secondary containment of the well pad membrane.

The well pad membrane integrity around the cellar was discussed including the method of the seal between the membrane and the cellar wall. The area around the cellar was being prepared to receive the fracturing equipment. This includes laying Terra Firma mats. There were no leaks observed around the edge of the cellar.

The frac trees were observed in place. No leaks from the frac trees or well head were observed. Cuadrilla finished cleaning down in this area and any contaminated pad stone has been stored in lined skips awaiting disposal off site. These skips were inspected and were lined and covered. Any rainwater accumulating on top of the cover is expected to be removed before the skips are taken from site. There were no signs of leakage around the skips.

Routine groundwater sampling from borehole 1 (BH1) was observed.

No odours were detected on site during the site inspection.

A visual inspection of the flares and associated equipment was undertaken. There had been no changes to the flare set up since our last inspection. Flares were non-operational at the time of the inspection. The flares are awaiting connection to the equipment associated with the well heads.

The ambient air monitoring equipment was observed in operation on site.

The drainage ditch was inspected and the level of water was low. Surface water has been pumped to the frac tanks for storage.
