This report covers the period of hydraulic fracturing activities between 13 August 2019 up to 20 August 2019 (sleeves 1 - 5). This inspection report includes the outcome of the reviews undertaken by the Environment Agency of the daily reports, microseismic monitoring data and traffic light system reports. Assessment of data/information from 21 August (sleeves 6 and 7) is currently ongoing.

Daily reports

Daily reports have been received following each hydraulic fracturing stage and include the information required by the Hydraulic Fracture Plan.

Microseismic monitoring data

The Hydraulic Fracture Plan sets out that cumulative post quality control microseismic event data for stages 1, 2, 3, 5, 10, 15, 20, 25, 30, 35, 40 and 45 will be available for the Environment Agency to view.

Stages 1, 2, 3 and 5 have been viewed and the microseismic event data is all within the subsurface permit boundary.

Traffic Light Events

On 19 August the Environment Agency was notified of two amber events on the Traffic Light System.

At 10:35am a 0.04ML event was detected during injection in to sleeve 4. The event was recorded at 464m from the injection point and was inside of the subsurface permit boundary.

At 11:06am a 0.09ML event was detected during injection in to sleeve 4. The event was recorded at 352m from the injection point and was inside of the subsurface permit boundary.

No issues with well integrity or permit boundary breaches were recorded.

Assessment of Sleeves 6 and 7

We are currently assessing the daily reports, microseismic monitoring data and traffic light system reports associated with sleeves 6 and 7. Following the assessment a CAR form will be issued in due course.
