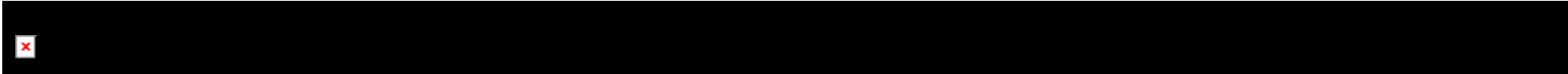

Thank you for your application received on 08/12/2022. The following is to confirm our conversation earlier today.

I need to ask you for some missing information before I can do any more work on your application. Please provide the following information:

- You need to submit an Ammonia Modelling Assessment that meets the requirements of our guidance on detailed modelling (<https://www.gov.uk/guidance/environmental-permitting-air-dispersion-modelling-reports>). Please submit the data input files. The charge for our assessment of your modelling is not included in your baseline application charge, however you have currently overpaid the application fee by £792 so I will take the additional payment of £620 from this and arrange a refund for the remaining overpayment (£172)

Note: I have attached a copy of the pre-application advice which was sent out on 06/08/20 for information, and attached the LWS/AW checklists again in case you wish to seek further information about them.

Note: Please consider the existing permitted scenario of 150,000 pullets, the actual stocked scenario of 150,000 broilers and the proposed scenario of 200,000 broilers in the modelling.

- You need to submit an Accident Risk Assessment, including consideration of the risks of fire and flooding. The detail and level of risk assessment must be site specific, process and location dependent. You must have measures and process controls in place to control and minimise the risks identified. These must be clearly stated in your assessment.
- You need to submit a revised site drainage plan.

Please reply directly to this email with your information and copy myself in separately as we have a new system in place.

Please send the information within 10 working days of this letter.

If we do not receive the information within 10 working days we will return your application.

If we do receive the requested information within 10 working days, we'll continue to check your application. We'll check to see if there's enough information for the application to be 'duly made'. Duly made means that we have all the information we need to begin determination. Determination is where we assess your application and decide if we can allow what you've asked for.

We'll let you know by letter whether your application can be duly made. If it can't be duly made, we'll return your application to you.

If we do have to return your application we'll send you a partial refund of your application payment. We'll retain 20% of the application charge to cover our costs in reviewing your application and requesting information. This maximum amount we'll retain is capped at £1,500.
