# BA3 5RX, JW Waste Recycling Limited: environmental permit consultation

The aim of this consultation is to ask whether you have any comments relevant to the permit application

We want to make the best decision when permitting. Listening to the views of others helps us to take account of concerns, or local environmental factors, that we may not be otherwise aware of.

We are seeking comments on the application for JW Waste Recycling Limited. Please use the reference number below when making comments on this application.

- Permit Number: EPR/EB3607KW/V005
- Regulated facility type: This application was made to vary the existing standard rules SR2015 No 6 permit to a bespoke permit by adding an additional biowaste activity. The operator proposes to treat residual municipal waste that is generated at the site via an enclosed aerobic digestion process taking place in industrialised units (Advetec XO22). The final product will be a floc that is suitable for onwards recovery offsite as Solid Recovered Fuel (SRF). The site would treat up to 9490 tonnes of residual municipal waste annually using the two units. There will be point source emissions to air from the units. The variation doesn't increases the throughput of the site, because the units treat waste generated onsite.
- Regulated facility location: Newbury Works, Coleford, Radstock BA3 5RX
