

EPR: Site Closure Plan

Site Name: J & A Moon

Site Address: Yarrow Hey

If pig operations were to cease, the following site closure plan would be implemented to remove all potential sources of pollution on the premises. The plan would be executed in stages, as outlined below.

1. Depopulation
2. Bedding Removal
3. Cleaning
4. Housing
5. Fuel
6. Chemicals
7. Feed
8. Waste
9. Site Services
10. Survey

1. Depopulation

All livestock and any fallen stock will be collected and removed from site.

2. Bedding Removal

All housing bedding will be removed by employees or contractors. All slurry will be exported off the holding to an appropriate recipient

3. Cleaning

All housing and equipment, including feeding and drinking apparatus, and any further items which have come into contact with the livestock, will be thoroughly cleaned and disinfected. Houses will be pressure washed and all tanks used for the collection and storage of washings will be emptied.

4. Housing

Once all equipment has been cleaned, it will be stored securely inside empty houses. All fan exhausts and ventilation shafts will be covered to prevent contamination and access from pests.

5. Fuel

Any remaining diesel in the generators would be syphoned and secured in designated containers for use within other internal farming enterprises.

6. Chemicals

All surplus chemicals and veterinary supplies will be returned to the supplier or delivered to another operational site. Any expired chemicals will be disposed of as per manufacturers guidelines.

7.Feed

Arrangements will be made for all surplus feed to be collected by the supplier and taken to another operational site. Bulk feed bins will be cleaned and disinfected. All access and draw-off points will be sealed.

8. Waste

All waste materials will be stored in suitable receptacles and arrangements will be made for collection by licensed contractors for appropriate waste disposal. Storage areas will be cleaned and disinfected.

9. Services

Contact electricity and water providers to switch off the supply to the site.

10. Survey

Once the above steps have been completed, the condition of the site will be compared to the original Site Condition Report. This will determine whether the operation of the site has caused any pollution to the area. If the survey determines the presence of pollution, it will be the responsibility of the site operator to remedy this to the satisfaction of the regulator.
