

EPR: Odour Management Plan

This plan establishes the likely sources of odour arising from swine housing, and outlines the procedures in place to prevent and minimise odour produced as a result of the farming practices.

There is no history of odour complaints resulting from the activities at the exsisting pig sheds.



The map to the left shows a 400m radius from the centre of the installation.

The prevailing wind direction for this site is South-westerly.

Odour Complaints Procedure

If an odour complaint is received, the business (Graeme Moon) will record this within the Odour Complaints Record.

Details of the complaint will be recorded and the business will add the following information: the activity(s) taking place at the time, timing of the complaint and weather conditions at time of complaint.

The likely reason(s) for the complaint will also be recorded, and the complainant contacted as appropriate.

Corrective measures will be taken (where reasonably practicable) to avoid reoccurrence.

The odour management plan will be updated accordingly, and shall be reviewed yearly.

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
