Hello Ian

I have taken a look through the document in the land remediation deployment application from Urban Soil Solutions at Kruger Tissue Works. I have a few questions, the answers and additional information will help me to complete my assessment:

- You mention in appendix 2 that you will 'Maintain secure processed material and quarantined material stockpiles.' Please indicate where these quarantine stockpile locations are, how you will keep the quarantined material separate from other waste and what measures are in place to stop the quarantined material migrating from these areas. If you are not proposing any quarantine areas please indicate why you think they are not needed.
- We don't have Pete Wilson's Wamitab certificate on record are you able to send it over?
- Please show your security measures on a site map (CCTV and fencing etc).
- Your risk assessment needs to at least include the elements covered in the generic risk assessment for SR2008No27 (<https://www.gov.uk/government/publications/standard-rules-sr2008-number-27>), please submit another more detailed risk assessment that doesn't rely heavily on the historic risk assessments of other activities. Odour should also be taken into account in this case, along with receptors like the nearby SSSI.
- When the area used for mixing is to be de-commissioned (east end New tip), there is a potential for there to be a hard thickness of treated sludge covering the HDPE which may prevent the liner from being recycled. Has this been considered?
- How will excess rainfall events impacting upon the curing of the mixtures, and what will be used to cover the curing piles if needed?

Having consulted our fisheries and biodiversity team due to the proximity of the WFD water course, local wildlife site and SSSI they have asked that temporary works adhere to Agency pollution prevention guidelines PPG5 where springs or running water are encountered. They also ask that you stabilise the course ash currently on the New tip site which is migrating towards and into the Eagley Brook watercourse from Springside Mill site. Can you confirm you will observe these recommendations?
