
The terms 'the Water Authority', 'the licence holder' and 'the applicant' refer to the Wessex Water Authority.

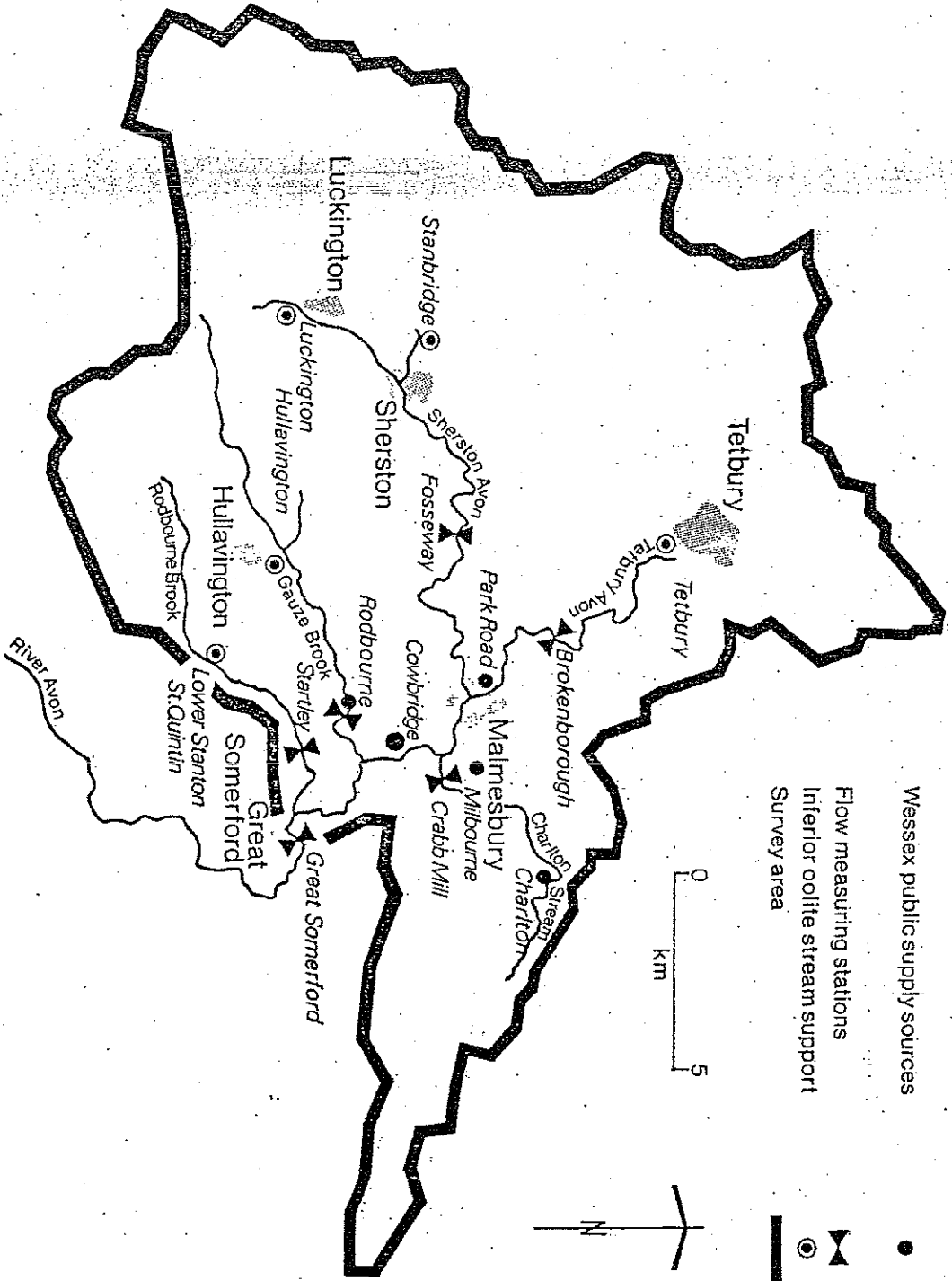
This licence shall remain in force until revoked.

## LICENCE TO ABSTRACT WATER

### NOTES

#### 1. CHARGES

This licence is subject to charges which are set out in the current issue of "The Wessex Water Authority Water Abstraction Charges Scheme".

#### 2. OFFENCES

It is an offence to abstract water except in accordance with the provisions of a licence. Works connected with the abstraction of water may not be constructed except in accordance with the provisions of a licence.

The Water Authority may ask for information about the abstraction. It is an offence not to give such information or knowingly or recklessly to give false information.

It is also an offence to alter a meter or gauge to prevent it measuring correctly.

#### 3. IMPORTANT NOTICE TO A SUCCESSOR TO THIS LICENCE

If you have become the holder of this licence, in accordance with Section 32(1), or regulations made under Section 32(3), of the Water Resources Act 1963, by succeeding to the previous licence holder's occupation of land specified in the licence as land on which water abstracted in pursuance of the licence is to be used, you should note that, by virtue of Section 32(2) of the above Act (or corresponding provisions in the regulations under Section 32(3)), you will cease to be the holder of the licence at the end of a period of one month from the date on which you became the occupier of the land in question unless before the end of that period you have given the Water Authority notice of the change in the occupation of the land.

SPECIAL CONDITIONS SUBJECT TO WHICH ABSTRACTION IS AUTHORISED

1. In the following provisions:-

"protected person", in relation to a reduction in supply at any point, means a person who is entitled to a protected right, as provided by Section 26 of the Act, in respect of the abstraction of water at that point, being a right which subsisted immediately before the date upon which this licence came into effect.

"agreed or determined" means (subject to paragraph 5 below) agreed between the protected person concerned and the licence holder or, in default of agreement, determined by an arbitrator appointed by them, or appointed, at the request of either of them, by the President of the Institution of Civil Engineers.

"relevant reduction" means so much of any reduction in the level or flow of water in a source of supply as is agreed or determined to be attributable to the abstraction of water by the licence holder in accordance with this licence.

2. Where it is agreed or determined:-

(a) that there has been a reduction in the level or flow of water in a source of supply at a point within the area bounded by a blue line on the attached Plan no. 2;

(b) that the reduction is wholly or to a substantial extent attributable to the abstraction of water by the licence holder in accordance with this licence;

and

(c) that, by reason of the reduction, a protected person is prevented from abstracting water at that point to the full extent of his protected right;

the licence holder, if asked to do so by or on behalf of the protected person concerned and if afforded the requisite access and information, shall take, or cause to be taken, in relation to the relevant reduction such action in accordance with the following provisions as is reasonably practicable in the circumstances of the case.

- (a) the carrying out of works at that point, including in particular the making of alterations in any well or borehole or in, or in the position of, equipment or apparatus, or the installation of fresh equipment or apparatus, and
- (b) the affording of a supply of water to the protected person and shall be such as it is agreed or determined ensures that the protected person is provided with, or with the means to obtain, a supply of water up to the quantity which he could reasonably have expected to abstract at that point in exercise of his protected right if the relevant reduction had not occurred.

4. The following provisions shall have effect in relation to the terms on which any such action is taken:-

(a) the protected person shall not be required to bear any part of the cost of the carrying out of works, or of the provision or installation of any equipment or apparatus (including any pipes, meters or fittings provided for the supply of water), but, except as may be otherwise agreed, any fittings (other than mains, pipes or meters) placed or fixed upon the premises of the protected person shall be repaired, maintained, renewed and made good by him, and at his expense, to the satisfaction of the licence holder;

(b) a charge may be made for a supply of water afforded to the protected person, provided that in respect of any period to which the charge relates the protected person shall not be required to pay for the supply more than whichever is appropriate of the following amounts, namely:-

(i) where the total quantity of water which he obtains in that period in respect of his protected right at the point in question is the quantity supplied, the amount of the cost (excluding abstraction charges under the Act) which it is agreed or determined he would have incurred in that period in abstracting the total quantity of water so obtained if the relevant reduction had not occurred (hereinafter called "the total abstraction costs");

(ii) where the total quantity of water which he so obtains is made up partly of water supplied and partly of water abstracted by him at that point in exercise of his protected right, the amount (if any) by which the total abstraction cost exceeds the cost (excluding abstraction charges under the Act) actually incurred by him in abstracting the quantity of water which he abstracted;

and subject thereto, the terms on which any action is taken in relation to a relevant reduction shall be such as may be agreed or determined.

5. Without prejudice to any action previously taken under the foregoing provisions in relation to a relevant reduction in supply:-

(a) where a question with respect to any of the matters specified at (a) to (c) of paragraph 2 above is determined by the court in proceedings taken against the authority for breach of statutory duty in respect of the grant of this licence, that determination by the court shall be conclusive for the purpose of the foregoing provisions notwithstanding any prior agreement or determination thereunder;

(b) where a protected person accepts or is awarded compensation or damages in respect of the effect of a relevant reduction, otherwise than by way of works done or a supply of water afforded in accordance with the foregoing provisions, those provisions shall not have effect so as to oblige the licence holder to take, or cause to be taken, action on the terms specified above in relation to that relevant reduction in so far as its effect is the subject of such compensation or damages;

and the foregoing provisions (with such modifications as may be necessary) shall apply for the purpose of deciding in the light of the determination by the court or, as the case may be, the acceptance or award of compensation or damages, what (if any) action the licence holder may then be required to take, or cause to be taken, and on what terms, having regard to the provisions of this paragraph.





### NOTES

#### 1. CHARGES

This licence is subject to charges which are set out in the current issue of "The Wessex Water Authority Water Abstraction Charges Scheme".

#### 2. OFFENCES

It is an offence to abstract water except in accordance with the provisions of a licence. Works connected with the abstraction of water may not be constructed except in accordance with the provisions of a licence.

The Water Authority may ask for information about the abstraction. It is an offence not to give such information or knowingly or recklessly to give false information.

It is also an offence to alter a meter or gauge to prevent it measuring correctly.

#### 3. IMPORTANT NOTICE TO A SUCCESSOR TO THIS LICENCE

If you have become the holder of this licence, in accordance with Section 32(1), or regulations made under Section 32(3), of the Water Resources Act 1963, by succeeding to the previous licence holder's occupation of land specified in the licence as land on which water abstracted in pursuance of the licence is to be used, you should note that, by virtue of Section 32(2) of the above Act (or corresponding provisions in the regulations under Section 32(3)), you will cease to be the holder of the licence at the end of a period of one month from the date on which you became the occupier of the land in question unless before the end of that period you have given the Water Authority notice of the change in the occupation of the land.

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
