Hi Kate

The Section 6.9 A(1)(a)(ii) activity for rearing broilers will be the principal user of the standby generator and fuel tank.

To provide electricity for ventilation to guarantee sufficient air renewal to preserve the health and well-being of chickens.

Already in place to serve adjacent industrial premises in event of grid outages and with capacity to supply both premises and poultry houses.

Rearing poultry will become the principal user on account the back-up generator must be tested once every seven days to comply with legal requirements.

A green line has been drawn around the generator and fuel tank to enclose it within the installation isn't this sufficient, like in other permits.

The land has been included in the Site Condition Report.

- If the primary purpose of the generator and fuel tank is to serve the Section 6.9 A(1)(a)(ii) activity, they must be included within the installation boundary. Please extend the boundary to include this additional land on the plan. You will also need to update the site condition report to include this additional land.
