

Hi we have spoken with our advisor and can advise the following:

These waste codes were included based on precedent from permits granted to comparable plants, with the aim of maintaining flexibility for potential future opportunities. We believe that, subject to appropriate waste acceptance and handling procedures, waste streams falling under the listed EWC codes could be suitable for incineration at the ERF. However, given that these are currently lesser priorities and in order to avoid unnecessary delays, we will withdraw these codes from the current application. Should the need arise in future, we would seek a permit variation supported by the necessary technical justification.
