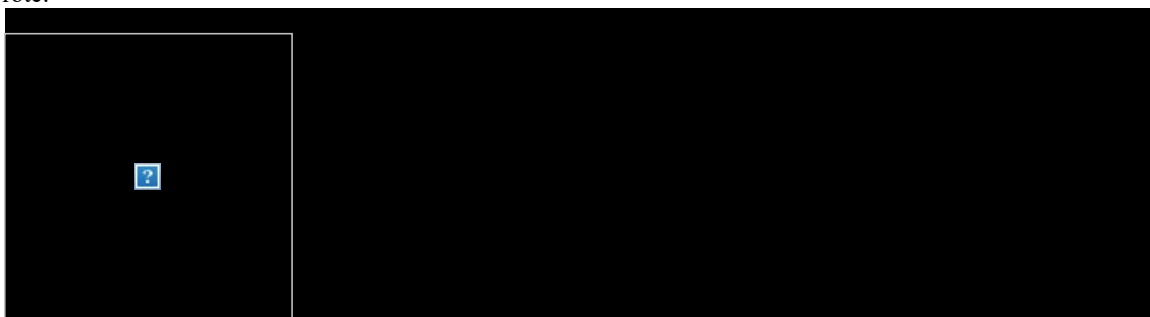

I have completed an initial review of the application and supporting documents and require additional information before the application can be duly made, as follows:

1. Installation boundary plan – please submit a revised plan as follows:
  - i. It appears that there is a residential receptor located within the installation boundary, Long Meadow Shute. Please amend the boundary to exclude this receptor.
  - ii. Label the two poultry houses, H1 and H2, on the plan.
2. Site drainage plan – please submit a revised plan as follows:
  - i. Indicate any impermeable surfacing on the plan.
  - ii. Indicate the drainage route for clean and dirty yard water from poultry house H1 on the plan, including any diverter valves.
  - iii. Indicate any chemical storage on the plan.
  - iv. Indicate any effluent drainage routes from the egg packing areas on the plan.
3. Please submit a raw materials inventory in accordance with question 8d of application form

You must send us the information by 24/07/24.

If we do not receive this by this deadline we will return your application.
