Well testing had not yet commenced at the time of inspection.

Inspection of records

The training record for flare operators (RE-05-FO-010) dated 16th August 2019 was inspected. Rathlin Energy Gas management plan, Capping procedures, Purging of well test equipment, Operation of well test/combustion units, Odour management plan, Recording flare stack temperature, and Leak detection and repair plan were recorded as trained out.

The training record for EXPRO well test operators (RE-05-FO-010) dated 15th August 2019 was inspected. Rathlin Energy Gas management plan, Leak detection and repair plan, Odour management plan, Vapour recovery plan, Management of scrubber reactants, Purging of well test equipment, and Capping procedures were recorded as trained out.

The 'Rathlin Energy West Newton 'A' site – Daily Environmental Report' check lists for 12th to 15th August 2019 were inspected and found to be complete.

The Tank, chemicals, fuel and lubricant inventories for 14th and 15th August 2019 were inspected.

A printed copy of the 'Emergency response plan onsite guidelines' (RE-04-005 Rev: 5.00 issued 04/01/2019) was present in the well site supervisor's office.

Site inspection

The EXPRO well test equipment was being assembled at the time of inspection. The tagging of joints and components for leak detection monitoring had not yet been carried out (requirement of Leak detection and repair plan Rev2 RE-EPRAWNA-LDAR-012).

It was reported that all pipe work is to be pressure tested with water prior to operation. Records relating to this will be checked at future inspection.

The activated carbon abatement for the water stock tank, oil stock tanks and oil storage tank vent lines had not yet been installed (requirement of Management of scrubber reactants work instruction Rev 5 RE-04-021).

Gas flow from the oil reservoir test will be measured using a low flow coriolis meter on the EXPRO equipment. The installed meter identification tag displayed the following information: Certification 19/76049, serial no. 14369641, Cal 12.03.2019. The calibration certificate for the meter will be checked at future inspection.

The CEB1200 and CEB4500 burners for disposal of waste gas and associated equipment and

propane support fuel were present on site. Spare thermocouples for temperature monitoring were held on site.

The open section of the perimeter containment ditch was inspected. The water was clear with no visible signs of contamination. Water level 30 on gauge board.

Procedure revisions

Copies of revised procedures 'RE-04-021 Rev 5 Management of scrubber reactants' and 'RE-04-035 Capping of flexible hoses work instruction' were received 07/08/2019. The revised procedures are agreed by the Environment Agency as a change to Environmental Permit Operating techniques Table S1.2 under permit condition 2.3.1 (a).
