- Form WR330 section B10 the NGR supplied for the abstraction location is only a six digit reference, we need an accurate ten digit NGR for the precise location of the borehole
- Form WR332 section C4 in the table in this part of the form you have specified the measurement method as 'cubic metres', please can you advise how the abstraction volumes will be ascertained, eg use of a water meter or pump capacity multiplied by time run calculation
- Form WR332 section C5.3 you have specified here that you have worked out your water requirements based on the number of dwellings supplied and their occupancy levels, please could you provide a breakdown of figures and volume calculations to show how the proposed abstraction quantities have been reached
