LS12 5JB, C O'Donovan And Sons Limited: environmental permit consultation

The aim of this consultation is to ask whether you have any comments relevant to the permit application

We want to make the best decision when permitting. Listening to the views of others helps us to take account of concerns, or local environmental factors, that we may not be otherwise aware of.

We are seeking comments on the application for C O'Donovan And Sons Limited. Please use the reference number below when making comments on this application.

- Permit Number: EPR/KB3500FS/V003
- Regulated facility type: The variation is to change the Waste Operation permit to become an Installation.
This variation application seeks the following:
 - To add a small area to the south of the current permit area which has recently been purchased by the applicant. The area is a private road, owned by the applicant, which will allow better access to the rear yard area and another smaller building that will be used to wash drums.
 - ii) To increase the annual throughput of waste material from 25,000 tonnes per annum to 200,000 tonnes.
 - iii) To increase the storage capacity of non-hazardous waste from 230 tonnes to 900 tonnes at any one time and for hazardous waste from 10 tonnes to 100 tonnes.
 - To increase the daily treatment capacity of non-hazardous waste to 900 tonnes per day and for hazardous waste to 100 tonnes per day.
 - To add a significant number of additional waste codes to the permit.

 - This makes the physio-chemical treatment part of the permitted activities to become an installation. So, in addition to the above changes, the variation also see to add physio-chemical treatment of hazardous waste (Section 5.3 A(ii) activity) and temporary storage of hazardous waste (Section 5.6 activity) as installation activities to the permit.
