Approval of an on farm combustion plant in which poultry manure is used as fuel

1. In accordance with Regulation 14 of The Animal By-Products (Enforcement) (England) Regulations 2013 and Articles 24 and 44 of Regulation (EC) No. 1069/2009, the Secretary of State temporarily approves:

to operate combustion plant- Polytechnik Luft HVR3300-19-2 WITH Hegwein BD4 Auxillary burner (LPG)on the premises , to combust poultry manure.*

2. The combustion plant must be operated in accordance with the manufacturer's and technology supplier's instructions.
3. The combustion plant/s must operate at 850°C with a gas retention time of 2 seconds or at 1100°C with a gas retention time of 0.2 seconds

* see note 1 for a definition of poultry manure

1. The poultry manure and the gases produced must be combusted at either 850°C or 1100°C. The gases must be retained for two seconds if the combustion temperature is 850°C or for 0.2 seconds if the combustion temperature is 1100°C. The temperature at which gases are combusted must be recorded automatically and be available for inspection by officers of the Animal and Plant Health Agency (APHA).
2. The emissions of sulphur dioxide, nitrogen oxides and particulate matter shall be measured annually unless secondary abatement equipment is installed in which case the emissions must be measured continuously.

Notes

1. Poultry manure is the excrement of poultry with or without litter. Only poultry manure that is unprocessed (has not received any prior treatment) may be used as fuel.
2. All the conditions of The Animal By-Products (Enforcement) (England) Regulations 2013/The Animal By-Products (Enforcement) (Wales) Regulations 2014 and Regulation (EC) No. 1069/2009 and Regulation (EU) No. 142/2011 must be complied with.
3. Changes to the ownership, address or operation of an approved Animal By-Product premises must be notified to your local APHA office.
