I hope your well.

I was out on farms yesterday with solar providers.

The Turkey farm manager says that there are always turkeys on the range and turkeys inside the building, I think 50% in 50% out would work well. The turkeys have unlimited access to the range 24/7.

I will investigate studying this in the future, I haven't found a study on this subject. The percentage would be applicable to both sites although Weston has more agroforestry within the ranges.

I have attached the East farm mixed weights for turkeys used on the original application and the emissions assessment from the previous variation.

The weights will be the end of the cycle, as in day old to 6kg – 6kg to 18kg finish.

Hi George,

Thanks for your email.

Wrt the turkeys, can you confirm an approximate percentage of time the birds will be outside on the ranging area and an approximate percentage in the houses, after the initial 42 days brooding period please, so we can more accurately assess emissions. Can you confirm whether this percentage split will be applicable across both sites please?

Can you also confirm whether the average weights provided in the spreadsheet (Weston.East Stocking Emissions V2), are average weights at the end of the cycle or average weights over the duration of the cycle, so we can get a better understanding please.

I am in a meeting now until 4ish. Will you be around later on to chat through the AYR crop again please?

I hope your well.

Yes, the new houses give more capacity to the site, and the birds will range after brooding from the same facility. The Turkeys have access to the houses, they can use them for shelter and food and water is supplied in the housing, they have free range and the pop holes are left open at all times.

The 160,000 is the AYR crop they call whites that is the super mini special grown for the 8 weeks or 18 weeks. (can you clarify what is different from the permit?)

240,000 is the Christmas turkey brood, 90,000 are removed from site and 150,000 grown to 25 weeks. This is the bronze.

I will get a document with the confirmation of the house building plans.

Let me know if that makes sense.

Hi George,

Thanks for the clarification. So the spreadsheet for East is correct and crops 2 and 3 will be an increase in turkeys, consisting of a max of 23,500 birds each crop rather than the currently permitted 20,000. Is this increase enabled because the two houses replacing the H block will be larger?

Did you have chance to query the spreadsheet for the existing 'post-Christmas crop' in terms of the text in column AC of the Weston spreadsheet (Day old to 8 weeks brood or 18 weeks finish). This appears to refer to some of the turkeys being grown to 8 weeks (56 days), and some to 18 weeks (126 days), which differs to what is currently permitted (The second, post-Christmas crop will place 162,000 larger turkeys for brooding which will all be grown to slaughter weight). Column AD states 42 days brooding (6 weeks) and column AE 70 days (10 weeks) to finish. Can you just clarify how this works again please?

Can I also just clarify whether the turkeys, that go out on the range after 42 days at both Weston and East, still have access to the houses and so will spend some of their time inside, or are they permanently outside after the 42 days?

Can you confirm in writing the start dates for the changes to housing at both East and Weston and expected dates for this work to be completed please. Please set out clearly the houses which are being changed, so for Weston I think we agreed it is houses 1 and 2 which are being replaced with the new houses on the same footprint, and for East I think we agreed it was houses 1A/1B & 2A/2B, which you refer to as H block, which will be replaced with the two new houses in a different location.
