- 1. In terms of the site drainage, the operator will now capture any contaminated surface water which is used from storing/treating waste from the external yard into an underground sealed tank which will be alarmed when near capacity to ensure it can be emptied by a tanker. The site is no longer proposing to drain any of this potentially contaminated water into the existing soakaway referenced in the current permit. The site will continue to drain clean surface water from roofs or not in connection with wastes storage to existing soakaways on site. The above can be easily updated on the site plan and in accompanying management plans. We consider this proposal reduces the risk significantly.
- 2. The operator wants to include a further extension to the permit boundary and add a Section 1.16.12 activity comprising the physical treatment of non-hazardous waste (see attached plan). Treatment activities for this will include sorting/separation, compacting, screening, crushing, blending, centrifuging and washing of non-hazardous waste. We consider if the operator pays the Section 1.16.12 fee of £7,930 and we update current management plans submitted within a timescale agreed with the EA, it should be feasible to continue under the current variation. Given the timescales of this current variation, we are concerned about waiting a further 19 months + before the operator could legally start this activity. We do not consider any further management plans would be required i.e. noise given crushing and screening have already been applied for on the current variation and to my understanding no concerns have been raised? Finally, the inspecting officers are also concerned with the timescales this variation has taken and are keen for the permit to be issued also, I do not think they would be happy with any further delays or if a new application was required.
