Dear team,

I would like the opportunity to make representations at a public Inquiry on the matter of an Acoustic Fish Deterrent at Hinkley Point C.

From publicity and communication from trusted bodies, I understand that EDF is trying to obtain permission to remove the requirement for an Acoustic Fish Deterrent at Hinkley Point C . As an opponent of the current DCO on Sizewell C in Suffolk, for a variety of reasons, including the damage that will be done in terms of 'marine churn', I am concerned that allowing EDF to build the sea water intake without an Acoustic Fish Deterrent would lead to an increase in the number of fish killed.

The Severn Estuary area around Hinkley has been newly designated as a Marine Protection Area, in which protected species should have absolute protection against processes that harm or kill them. Seawater extraction for Hinkley Point's new cooling system would cause mass fish-kill; thus, EDF should seek an alternative cooling system on land .

Further damage to the marine world would be caused by the nuclear contaminants that would be disturbed in construction

The killing of European Protected Species, sucked in during the abstraction process, is forbidden under the Conservation of Habitats & Species law, when there is an alternative.

There is an alternative - to build a cooling system on the Hinkley Point site, using air-cooling or evaporative cooling towers.
