Dear Sir/Madam

I wish to lodge my objection to the variation to the above permit submitted by EdfGenco to change their arrangements to their construction plans for the new cooling system at Hinkley Point C . A condition placed on EDFGenco by the Environment Agency was that permission to build Hinkley C was dependent on Acoustic Fish Deterrents (AFDs) being placed on the two massive cooling water intake heads 3 kilometres offshore from the Nuclear site.

I wish to go further and suggest that Seawater extraction for Hinkley Point's new cooling system will cause mass fish-kill, including countless juveniles. The new designation of Marine Protection Area should require scrapping of the old license to ensure that protected species (Twaite/Alis shad, river and sea lampreys) and the at-risk European eel have absolute protection against processes that harm or kill them. This planning Inquiry is the opportunity to get the 2013 license cancelled. I would like to suggest that EdfGenco be told to change their construction plans and instead build a cooling system on the Hinkley Point site, using air-cooling or evaporative cooling towers.

I look forward to confirmation of my objection to the variation of the license and to hear from you in due course with the plans for an Inquiry
