My wife and I want a chance to make representations at a fully public Inquiry. The terms of the Inquiry should be wide, to allow scrapping of the licence to be fully considered, because any feasible fish diversion measures could not meet the Habitats Regulation.

Further grounds for scrapping include:

- The new international status of the area as a Marine Protection Area.
- The nuclear contaminants that would be disturbed in construction
- The killing of European Protected Species (EPS) sucked in with the abstracted water.

The killing of EPS is forbidden under the Conservation of Habitats & Species law, when there is an alternative. There is an alternative - to build a cooling system on the Hinkley Point site, using air-cooling or evaporative cooling towers. This is important as whatever EDF can get away with at Hinkley Point they will try and do at Sizewell in Suffolk.
