

# D7 Description of impounding works

# D7.1 Please give us a full description of your proposals to build, alter or remove impounding works. (Continue on a separate sheet if you need to.)

Details are provided in the attached Environmental Report with accompanying drawings.

The historic impoundment comprises 6 stop-logs which impound the headrace to the "2nd Wheelpit" at Cromford Mill. The top stop-log is raised by rotating 2 hand-wheels on vertical spindles, allowing flow into the wheelpit to be regulated. The lower 5 stop-logs will be replaced with a masonry wall, constructed to the same height as the present overspill (84.697). Downstream of the wall will be a new 6mm overwash screen with sump below. Flow in the sump will be diverted sideways to a Francis turbine behind the north wall of the wheelpit. The turbine draft tube will discharge into the wheelpit

A 4.9m waterwheel will be installed on the south side of the wheelpit, for aesthetic and educational purposes.

The top, adjustable stop-log will be retained in its present form and will continue to moderate the upstream water level, ensuring overspill into the Cromford Canal.
