Avoidance, Recovery and Disposal of Waste

The unit, in its inherent nature, does not generate large amounts of waste, however what it does produce is detailed below:

- **Cardboard and Plastic-** this material, whilst not produced in large quantities has been deemed to be recyclable and so a blue recycling bin has been ordered with East Riding of Yorkshire Council into which all such cardboard and plastic waste will now be disposed of.
- **Plastic Liquid containers-** this material has also been deemed to be recyclable and any such containers should be thoroughly washed out and disposed of in the blue recycling bin.
- **General Waste-** any general waste should be either be disposed of in the blue or green commercial bins and staff should make an informed decision on whether they believe it to be recyclable or not. As much recyclable material should be placed in the blue bin as possible.
- Fallenstock- Dead birds are collected twice a week by Webster's fellmongers and "recycled" at a registered rendering plant.
- Manure, Spent Litter and Dirty Water- All manure, spent litter and dirty water is exported to Burton Agnes Renewables Ltd and recorded in the Great Houndales Muck Export Record.
