This report relates to the announced site inspection by Kelly Hudson (Environment Officer) and Simon Caine (Regulatory Specialist) on Tuesday 13 July 2021.

This was an announced routine site inspection due to Covid-19 restrictions. The inspection was carried out in the presence of Robert Couldwell.

This site visit was arranged to review the preparatory works currently being undertaken and the continuing engineering works. During the inspection, the perimeter of the site was walked over and the following points were noted.

A visual inspection of the waste being utilised, for the construction of engineered bunds around Cell 1, indicate that appropriate inert wastes are being selected. Robert advised that some material was brought in from MHH Carlisle Street. After a discussion with the Environment Officer who regulates MHH Carlisle Street, I am satisfied that this is inert material that was not affected by the recent fire at the Carlisle Street site.

As noted in CAR 61563/0396084, prior notification must be provided to the Environment Agency as to when David Killick (Arley Consulting Company Ltd) will be undertaking taking sampling/testing of engineered bunds, so that we can be present.

It was also noted in the above CAR, that the surface water infrastructure needs to be CQA validated and that CQA Engineers must undertake an assessment of the works currently being undertaken. This is in accordance with Section 4 of the Surface Water Drainage Construction Proposals and CQA Programme, agreed in accordance with pre-operational condition 3.

Actions:

- As soon as a date is scheduled for sampling/testing of the engineered bunds, please contact the Yorkshire landfill inbox to advise, at <u>Yorkshire-landfill@environment-agency.gov.uk</u>.
- Provide an update on progress regarding the CQA validation and assessment of the surface water infrastructure. This should also be sent to the Yorkshire landfill inbox at <u>Yorkshire-landfill@environment-agency.gov.uk</u>. This should be received by 24 August 2021.
- Provide documentation to show the waste codes and amount of material that has been brought into Grange Landfill for the purpose of engineering. This should be sent to the Yorkshire landfill inbox at <u>Yorkshire-landfill@environment-agency.gov.uk</u>. This should be received by 24 August 2021.

The Wheel-wash unit has now been installed on site and is operational. As requested during the previous site inspection, there is also a bowser on site, which will be filled from the surface water lagoons and utilised as appropriate in order to supress dust. There is also a road-sweeper on site, to be used as a last resort if there is any mud tracked outside of the site.

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As noted in CAR 61563/0396084, section 10.1 of the EMS states that the compound will be secured by 2 metre palisade fencing, whereas proposals are to install a 2 metre high steel sheeting to obscure the visual presence of equipment on site. Video security equipment has now also been reinstated. As requested in the above CAR, please provide this proposal in writing to us, so we can formally approve a change in the EMS.

Action:

 Provide the proposed changes to the EMS in writing to the Yorkshire landfill inbox at <u>Yorkshire-landfill@environment-agency.gov.uk</u>. This should be received by 06 September 2021.

As noted in CAR 61563/0396084, agreement has been given by RMBC on reinstatement of BH05 on their land and we will be requesting that this borehole be installed as soon as possible.

No mud was evident on haul road leading to main highway at the time of entering or leaving the site. During the inspection, there was no evidence of dust leaving the site.

You must take immediate action to rectify any non-compliance and prevent repetition. Non-compliance with your permit conditions constitutes an offence* and can result in criminal prosecutions and/or suspension or revocation of a permit.
